Ariel Sharon lauded at Israel state memorial service – BBC (UK), 13 January 2014

Mr Sharon, regarded by many Israelis as a great statesman but widely loathed in the Arab world, died on Saturday aged 85 after eight years in a coma. Speakers at the state memorial for Israel's former PM Ariel Sharon have described him as an "indomitable" man devoted to the security of his people.

Dozens killed in Iraq bomb attacks - BBC (UK), 15 January 2014

At least 41 people have been recently killed in a series of bombings in central Iraq, police and medical officials say. Sixteen died in an attack on Wednesday 15 January on a funeral for a pro-government Sunni militiaman in a village south of Baquba, the capital of Diyala province. Seven car bombs meanwhile exploded across Baghdad, killing at least 25 people and wounding dozens more.

The Leaders of the EU visit Latvia to congratulate it with the introduction of euro – Latvia.eu (LV). 15 January 2014

European Council President Herman Van Rompuy and European Commission President Jose Manuel Barroso visited Riga on January 10 to welcome Latvia as the 18th member entrance in the Eurozone and meet with Latvian officials. Mr. Barroso said that Latvia's joining the Eurozone on January 1 was the best demonstration of the currency zone's resilience despite the recent predictions it would implode due to high debts and recessions in several member states. Also, he indicated that Latvia is a "shining example" of how an economy can reap benefits from painful reforms, reminding that Latvia is the EU's fastest-growing economy for the third consecutive year with an estimated GDP growth of 4,2%.

European Commission warns: ES citizenship is not allowed to sell – delfi.lv (LV), 16 January 2014

EU justice commissioner Viviane Reding has roundly criticised Malta for its EU passport sale scheme. "Citizenship must not be up for sale," she told MEPs in Strasbourg on Wednesday, noting that Malta is bound by the EU treaties to consider the impact of its actions on other EU countries. The difference between Malta and other countries introducing similar systems is that Malta is planning to sell 20.000 EU passports, while other countries – Cyprus, Latvia, UK and Portugal – are selling resident permits.

Thailand crisis: Protesters launch Bangkok 'shutdown' – *BBC (UK), 13 January 2014*Protesters are blocking roads in parts of the Thai capital, Bangkok, in a bid to oust the government before snap elections on 2 February. Albania scores 54th in Heritage Foundation's 2014 Index of Economic Freedom – Gazeta Shqiptare (Albania), 15 January 2014
